Financial

Our precept for this financial year was £22,000.

The 2009/2010 accounts have been passed by our external auditors. Accounts are available for inspection by prior arrangement with the Clerk for people on our electoral register. During the year a Finance Committee was established to ensure the recommendations of the Auditors are carried out.

Financial Agreement Forms are completed by the organisations, which specify that any unused funds (for the purpose for which they were donated) must be returned to this Council. Also, regular reports can be requested by this Council on progress of the project and that should the group cease to exist any residual monies should be returned.

Community Walkabout

This group consists of members from: New Earswick Parish Council, City of York Council – Street Scene, Joseph Rowntree Housing Trust (JRHT), New Earswick Residents Forum (NERF) and sometimes the Neighbourhood Policing Team. The group meet monthly and cover a designated area of the Parish each time. Any issues in the area (e.g. garden maintenance, litter, dog-fouling, traffic issues, potholes, Rights of Way maintenance, graffiti, bus shelters etc.) are then taken up by the specific organisation responsible and dealt with. Notes of the meetings are kept on file by the Clerk.

Policing

The Safer Neighbourhood Team is made up of Police Community Support Officers (PCSO's). The PCSO's regularly patrol the ward on foot and visit the schools and local groups/organisation to integrate into the local community more. Monthly crime figures are also sent to this Parish Council and shifts permitting, the Police attend our monthly meetings and/or email monthly reported crimes.
